- Bev Watford is the incoming PIC IV Chair
- PIC IV has 13 divisions
- Monolith will be taking over for Smoothpaper
 - o It will integrate membership, registrations, papers, etc.
 - o Designed specifically for us.
 - o Anticipate a learning curve, but hopefully smoother than smoothpaper.
 - o Advantages: 5-7 people to administer instead of 1, includes a testing site
 - Work in progress
- Frank Huband is retiring after 20 years as Executive Director
 - o They want membership to be involved in finding the new director. You'll see some e-mails about this if you're interested.
- Task force related to plagiarism is being formed if you're interested in being a part of it.
- Diversity task force Bev Watford is working on this. There were recommendations in 2002 that have not been acted on.
- Operating funds reallocated: \$1 per member is in our operating funds and will leave at the end of the year
 - We have had a lot of growth in 2 years. 450-748 members. Our operating budget will go up by this.

 - NS: Board has suggested something more like an industry day. If our group could come
 with a proposal that made sense, it would be heard
 - o NS: Money is going to break even or lose money.
 - o NS: Heard great things about our workshop on Saturday. Lots of accolades.
 - o Liz: K-12 workshop is local teachers. Our bring a teacher for workshop would be national teachers that we're doing research with.
 - o Mindy: Can our ASEE K-12 Div members bring a teacher similar to bring a student? The teacher would still need a full paying sponsor.
 - o NS: The number of student members has passed the number of life members for the first time ever.
- Liz: Do we really need 7am sessions?

- NS: These started with the California conference in which it was an east-west thing. It's now very hard for west coast members to do 7am at an east coast conference. Vancouver may help.

- 3. Program Chair for ASEE 2010 (Louisville, Kentucky, June 20-23, 2010) John Chen
 - Update on this year's Program
 - Thank you to 2 reviewers per paper on one call for reviewers.
 - Liz: There were a few problems with the moderators. It's not John's fault.
 - Liz: K12 sessions were very well attended and Susan will give us the data.
 - Mary-Beth: How do we give feedback on the topic of the session? She went to one where the 1st 2 papers didn't match the topic.
 - i. Teri: The program chairs understand that sometimes the topic is a stress.
 - ii. XX: Why are we running so many sessions?
 - iii. YY: When you shrink it, you lose attendance which is bad for the division.
 - iv. Mindy: Can we get a bit better alignment of the topics with sessions?
 - v. Susan: We should be able to rename the sessions next year with Monolith and before, the sessions were harder to change.
 - vi. Teri: Often you put the best paper at the end to keep people in the session.
 - Best Practices in Partnerships Panel Stacy Klein-Gardner
 - i. Went better this year than last year.
 - ii. It's hard that we've got two sessions at the same time.
 - iii. 13 applications for best practices in partnerships panel and 3 accepted. This is the same number as last year. There were 7 from high school, 3 from elementary and 4 from middle school.
 - Susan Stats:
 - i. 45 people per session average or so people who popped in for one paper
 - ii. Best practices was highest 50-60 people
 - iii. 68 people walked in for the Assessment in K-12 Engineering Session Standing room only

 - New Best Practices in Assessment of Participant Outcomes Panel for June 2011
 - i. People invited to present will work together on a proceedings paper.
 - ii. Perhaps a journal article will come out of this as well.

- iii. Five panelists: Informal, teacher professional development, K-5, 6-8, HS
- iv. Eugene Brown will help with the project Susan acknowledged that he's already in since it's his idea.
- This year we did the curriculum exchange poster session:
 - i. ASEE promised tables for activities, but this unfortunately didn't happen.
 - ii. Presentations were great.
 - iii. Perhaps instead of a poster session, we could do this as a room session to get tables in a regular room.
- XX: Suggestion for more cross pollination of divisions.
 - i. Liz says we used to do that, but we've noticed that other divisions send things back to us.
 - ii. John agrees he was sent lots of papers. WIE sends papers to us as a policy for K-12 stuff.
 - iii. Teri suggests we co-sponsor sessions that are almost all K-12 from another division. John suggests we ask the program chair from ERM during the year just to see if they're doing something like this.
 - iv. Susan: MIED wants to continue co-sponsoring a workshop.

 - i. We need a better location. That's Louisville specific.
 - ii. Perhaps we can do more with this.

- 7. K-12 Saturday Workshop Mindy
 - Panel and Focus Groups Bette, Larry, Gene, Liz
 - i. Breakout session notes will be written up by Larry and Gene and will be on the website
 - ii. Only 150 spots in any of the workshops, this was a problem
 - iii. Marion: Many of the individual sessions were as low as 25
 - iv. Liz: We need to think about doing this for larger numbers. Try not to limit it.
 - v. Marion: We need to have some large sessions even if there are small ones.
 - vi. Liz: It's VERY hard to control which sessions teachers are going to go to.
 - vii. Marion: Used to be an emphasis on faculty seeing stuff. Is this just a teacher workshop now?
 - Report on Sunday discussion of templates for regional conferences
 - i. A lot of work goes into the Saturday workshop 4 months of Libby's time
 - ii. We'd like to reach more teachers.
 - iii. Sponsors would like to reach more teachers.
 - iv. Could we do this workshop as a template that would be easier to put on and be more consistent from a messaging perspective?
 - v. We would then use the template at 10-11 regional workshops in addition to the national workshop.
 - 1. Half day and/or full day?
 - 2. Leave time for local hot-button interest
 - 3. This is in the beginning stages.
 - 4. If you are a regional person that feels strongly one way or another, let us know. We don't know if regions are interested?
 - 5. Next year in Vancouver is a bit up in the air since it's international. It's hard to predict what we may get.
 - 6. XX: Would we consider a webinar for some of the things we did on Saturday?
 - 7. Liz: Great idea. This also helps with reaching more people including faculty as Marion asked in addition to teachers.
 - 8. YY: Have we thought about partnering with a National organization to do some of the legwork for us. Formerly HEMAC and now Great Minds in STEM is interested in partnering to do this more often.
 - 9. Liz: We may not be able to give up control for something like this. ASEE headquarters would have a different motivation for this.
 - 10. Steven O-Brien New Jersey Institute of Technolgoy perhaps we can connect with groups an hour south of British Columbia.
